

For financial disclosure statements submitted on or after January 1, 2019, the Ethics Law (5-606) requires they be freely available to the public on the Internet, through an online registration program. This requirement applies to the following filers:

State Officials and candidates for office as State officials (other than State officials of the Judicial Branch) – defined in the Ethics Law (§5-101(II)) as follows:

- (1) a constitutional officer or officer-elect in an executive unit (Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, Treasurer, Comptroller, Secretary of State, and Adjutant General);
- (2) a member or member-elect of the General Assembly;
- (3) a State's Attorney;
- (4) a clerk of the circuit court;
- (5) a register of wills; or
- (6) a sheriff

Secretary of a principal department in the Executive Branch - § 8-201 of the State Government Article defines the Principal Departments of the Executive Branch as follows:

- (1) Aging;
- (2) Agriculture;
- (3) Budget and Management;
- (4) Commerce;
- (5) Disabilities;
- (6) the Environment;
- (7) General Services;
- (8) Health;
- (9) Housing and Community Development;
- (10) Human Services;
- (11) Information Technology;
- (12) Juvenile Services;
- (13) Labor, Licensing, and Regulation;
- (14) Natural Resources;

- (15) Planning;
- (16) Public Safety and Correctional Services;
- (17) State Police;
- (18) Transportation; and
- (19) Veterans Affairs.
