## MINUTES OF THE STATE ETHICS COMMISSION MEETING

June 15, 2023

ITEM 1: Tentative Agenda

Ms. Allgair acknowledged the Commission's two summer interns, Katylee Cannon and Spencer Balducci, and thanked them for their work over the last several months. Ms. Allgair also advised that new attorney position of Assistant Counsel was added in the FY24 budget and the agency will begin the interview and hiring process in September.
