<u>Decision:</u> The Commission granted exceptions to allow secondary employment for all matters.

<u>ITEM 32:</u> Informal Matter – Memo on Non-Participation Plans and Mitigation Agreements

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Colquhoun presented one non-participation plan or mitigation agreement provided and approved of by the staff. The matter included 25-0124.

<u>ITEM 33:</u> Informal Matter – Maryland Stadium Authority (25-0249)

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Colquhoun briefed the Commission on a non-participation agreement checklist developed by the Maryland Stadium Authority for advice from the Commission.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission advised that the checklist was consistent with the Public Ethics Law and encouraged the Maryland Stadium Authority to provide the Commission with any questions its members or employees had regarding the checklist.

<u>ITEM 34:</u> Informal Matter – Office of the Attorney General (25-0170)

<u>Discussion</u>: Mr. Colquhoun briefed the Commission on whether employees who took the deferred resignation from the federal government and started state employment need to have their employment reviewed as secondary employment while receiving deferred compensation.

Decision: The Commission advised that this need not be reviewed as secondary employment.

ITEM 35: Informal Matter – Blind Trust Update (22-0861)

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Colquhoun briefed the Commission on the receipt of the Certificate of Continued Compliance regarding a blind trust.

Decision: No further action is needed by the Commission.

<u>ITEM 36:</u> Informal Matter – Department of Health (25-0092)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Watson briefed the Commission on a secondary employment and financial interest request regarding an employee in the Department of Health having a business that is regulated by the Department.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission granted an exception to allow this secondary employment and financial interest.

Discussion: The Commission was asked to provide advice as to whether a discount was a gift.

<u>Decision:</u> Based upon circumstances the Commission advised that the discount was not a gift but a benefit of employment.

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<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair provided updates and provided guidance on proposed legislation which includes SB185/HB166 - Maryland Public Ethics Law - State Officials of and Candidates to be State Officials of the Judicial Branch - Conflicts of Interest and Financial Disclosure Statements, SB251/HB230 - Maryland Public Ethics Law - Training and Financial Disclosure Requirements - Revisions, HB717 - Natural Resources - Public Lands - Acquisition, Staffing, Operations, and Funding, SB109 - Maryland Public Ethics Law - School Boards - Compliance Certification, and HB 932 - Public Ethics - Conflicts of Interest and Blind Trust - Governor.
