LOBBYIST FILING AGREEMENT

STATE ETHICS COMMISSION

RECITALS

The State Ethics Commission ("the Commission") is the executive agency of the State of Maryland established by Chapter 513, Acts of 1979 for the purpose of enforcing the Maryland Public Ethics Law (General Provisions Article, Title 5, Annotated Code of Maryland) (hereinafter the "Public Ethics Law") including the provisions of Subtitle 7, the lobbying disclosure program.

Regulated lobbyists are required to file Activity Reports (Form #4) reporting expenditures and compensation for each of the lobbyist's employers. This includes the reporting of gifts given to officials or employees or their immediate family. Md. Code Ann., Gen'l. Prov. Art. § 5-705(b). The Ethics Law defines a gift as "the transfer of anything of economic value, regardless of form, without adequate and lawful consideration." Md. Code Ann., Gen'l. Prov. Art. § 5-101(p)(1).

A regulated lobbyist who gives gifts with a cumulative value of \$75.00 or more to State officials or employees or their immediate family within one of the six month reporting periods (November 1 to April 30 or May 1 to October 31) is required to file either a Form #13C (Disclosure of Gifts \$75 or More from Single Employer) or #13D (Disclosure of Gifts \$75 or More from One or More Employers or Lobbyist Using Personal Funds). Form #13C is used to disclose gifts paid for by a single lobbyist employer and Form #13D is used to disclose gifts paid for by the lobbyist personally or by multiple employers. Md. Code Ann., Gen'l. Prov. Art. § 5-705(c). A regulated lobbyist must file the Form #13C or #13D even if the gifts were unrelated to lobbying activity. Md. Code Ann., Gen'l. Prov. Art. § 5-705(c)(1)(ii).

State officials and employees are prohibited from accepting certain gifts from "controlled donors." "Controlled donors" include individuals or businesses that: 1) do business with or seek to do business with the official's or employee's agency; 2) are regulated by the official's or employee's agency; 3) have private interests that can be impacted by an official's or employee's performance of his/her duties; or 4) are regulated lobbyists with respect to matters within the jurisdiction of the official or employee. Md. Code Ann., Gen'l. Prov. Art. § 5-505(b)(2)(i-iv).

The Public Ethics Law allows controlled donors to give and State officials and employees to receive certain categories of gifts. State officials and employees are strictly prohibited from accepting: 1) cash; 2) gift cards; and 3) tickets to sporting events from controlled donors.

¹ A more detailed discussion of the Public Ethics Law's gifts provisions are included in the Commission's <u>The Gift Law</u> memorandum dated September 10, 2015 and its memorandum entitled <u>Gift Reporting for Lobbyists</u> dated October 1, 2014.

State officials and employees who are financial disclosure filers must disclose gifts with a value more than \$20 from: 1) a regulated lobbyist; 2) an entity regulated by the State; or 3) an entity doing business with the State on Schedule D of their disclosure. Md. Code Ann., Gen'l. Prov. Art. § 5-607(e).

Tabb J. Bishop ("the filer") is an individual whose lobbying activities on behalf of Verizon Communications, ("the employer") for the period November 5, 2015 to October 31, 2016, required him to register as a lobbyist with the Commission. Verizon Communications and Morgan State University, an executive unit of State government, have a joint learning program that has existed since 2015.

In 2016, the filer gave a Morgan State University employee two tickets to a pre-season Baltimore Ravens football game with a value of \$146.00. The Morgan State University employee disclosed the tickets on Schedule D of his 2016 Financial Disclosure Statement. The filer did not disclose the gift of the tickets on his Activity Report for the period of May 1, 2016 to October 31, 2016 or by filing a Form #13C (Disclosure of Gifts \$75 or More from Single Employer) for that period.

Staff Counsel informed the Morgan State University employee that the gift of sporting event tickets was prohibited. On or about April 21, 2017, the Morgan State University employee reimbursed Verizon Communications for the cost of the tickets.

Staff Counsel informed the filer that the gift was prohibited and that he failed to disclose it. On May 8, 2017, the filer filed an Amended Activity Report and Form #13C relating to the meals and beverages for the DPSCS employee.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the submission of amended reports by the filer, and the admissions and agreements herein contained, the filer and Staff Counsel stipulate and agree as follows:

- 1. The filer did not properly file a complete lobbying Activity Report for the period of May 1, 2016 to October 31, 2016 as required by § 5-705(b).
- 2. The filer did not file a Form #13C for the period of May 1, 2016 to October 31, 2016 as required by § 5-705(c).
- 3. On May 8, 2017, the filer amended his Activity Report for the period of May 1, 2016 to October 31, 2016 and filed Form #13C with the Commission.
- 4. The filer understands that failure to comply with the lobbying disclosure provisions of the Public Ethics Law may subject him to a formal complaint by the Commission and, upon finding of a violation, late fees and the possibility of civil fines.

- 5. Based on the facts stated in this agreement, the filer agrees to pay as settlement of the matter the amount of FIVE HUNDRED and no/100 Dollars (\$500.00) at the time of the execution of this agreement in lieu of potential late fees and civil fines for the failure to disclose gifts on the proper line of his Activity Report and for failure to file a Form #13C.
- 6. The Staff Counsel will, upon execution of this Agreement by the filer, recommend that the Commission not institute any proceedings on the filer's failure to disclose gifts on the proper line of his Activity Report and failure to file Form #13C. The filer understands that the Commission is under no obligation to accept this agreement and may decide to take other action, including issuing a complaint.
- 7. The filer waives a formal hearing on this matter (if the agreement is accepted by the Commission) to which it would be entitled if a complaint were issued, and he understands that this Agreement and materials relating to this matter are not subject to the confidentiality provisions of the Ethics Law, and will be public information unless otherwise protected.
- 8. The filer understands a copy of this agreement will be mailed to the Verizon Communications.
- 9. The filer and the Staff Counsel have entered into this Agreement for the sole purpose of resolving the failure to disclose gifts on the appropriate line of his Activity Report, failure to file Form #13C, for the payment in lieu of a late fee and fine, and for no other purpose.
