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# LOBBYIST SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

This Agreement, made this 1944 day of June, 2019, by and between Jeffry F. Guido, lobbyist for North American Building Trades Unions, and William J. Colquhoun, Staff Science Counsel to the Maryland State Ethics Commission (hereinafter "Staff Counsel").

### RECITALS

The State Ethics Commission ("the Commission") is the executive agency of the State of Maryland established by Chapter 513, Acts of 1979 for the purpose of enforcing the Maryland Public Ethics Law (General Provisions Article, Title 5, Annotated Code of Maryland) (hereinafter the "Ethics Law") including the provisions of Subtitle 7, the lobbying disclosure program.

Jeffry F. Guido is an individual whose lobbying activities on behalf of North American Building Trades Unions for the period of November 28, 2018 to October 30, 2019, required him to register as a lobbyist with the Commission.

Regulated lobbyists are required to file Activity Reports (Form #4) reporting expenditures and compensation for each of the lobbyist's employers. This includes the reporting of gifts given to officials or employees or their immediate family. Md. Code Ann., Gen'l Prov. Art., § 5-705(b)(2)(xi). The Ethics Law defines a "gift" as "the transfer of anything of economic value, regardless of form, without adequate and lawful consideration." Md. Code Ann., Gen'l Prov. Art., § 5-101(p)(1).

State officials and employees are prohibited from accepting certain gifts from "controlled donors." Controlled donors include individuals or businesses that: 1) do business with or seek to do business with the official's or employee's agency; 2) are regulated by the official's or employee's agency; 3) have private interests that can be impacted by an official's or employee's performance of his/her duties; or 4) are regulated lobbyists with respect to matters within the jurisdiction of the official or employee. Md. Code Ann., Gen'l Prov. Art., § 5-505(b)(2)(i-iv).

The Ethics Law allows controlled donors to give and State officials and employees to receive certain categories of gifts. Relevant to this matter, an employee may accept an unsolicited gift with a value of \$20 or less from a controlled donor. Md. Code Ann., Gen'l Prov. Art., § 5-505(c)(2)(iii). State officials and employees are strictly prohibited from accepting: 1) cash; 2) gift cards; and 3) tickets to sporting events from controlled donors. The Ethics Law strictly prohibits a regulated lobbyist from making a gift that the lobbyist knows or has some reason to know is in violation of Subtitle 5. Md. Code Ann., Gen'l Prov. Art., § 5-714(8).

Mr. Guido timely filed his Activity Report on May 9, 2019. Mr. Guido reported to the Commission that he gave flowers to two employees of the Maryland General Assembly. Mr. Guido advised the Commission that he spent \$48.89 on one bouquet of flowers, and \$47.89 on the

second bouquet of flowers. He further advised the Commission that the employees were unaware of the value of the flowers.<sup>2</sup>

Mr. Guido has fully cooperated in Staff Counsel's investigation into this matter.

**NOW THEREFORE**, in consideration of the admissions and agreements herein contained, Mr. Guido and Staff Counsel stipulate and agree as follows:

- 1. Mr. Guido gave gifts that were in excess of the value allowable in violation of Section 5-714(8) of the Ethics Law.
- 2. Mr. Guido understands that failure to comply with the lobbying prohibitions of the Ethics Law may subject him to a formal complaint by the Commission and, upon finding of a violation, late fees and the possibility of civil fines.
- 3. That the Commission will issue a reprimand to Mr. Guido effective the date of this Agreement.
- 4. Based on the facts stated in this Agreement, Mr. Guido agrees to pay as settlement of the matter the amount of FIVE HUNDRED and no/100 Dollars (\$500.00) at the time of the execution of this Agreement in lieu of potential late fees and civil fines for the above admitted violation of providing gifts in excess of the allowable value to two employees of the General Assembly.
- 5. The Staff Counsel will, upon execution of this Agreement by Mr. Guido, recommend that the Commission not institute any proceedings for the giving of gifts to two State employees in excess of \$20 in value. Mr. Guido understands that the Commission is under no obligation to accept this Agreement and may decide to take other action, including issuing a complaint.
- 6. Mr. Guido waives a formal hearing on this matter (if the Agreement is accepted by the Commission) to which he would be entitled if a complaint were issued, and he understands that this Agreement and materials relating to this matter are not subject to the confidentiality provisions of the Ethics Law, and will be public information unless otherwise protected.
- 7. Mr. Guido understands that a copy of this Agreement and reprimand will be mailed to his employer.
- 8. Mr. Guido and the Staff Counsel have entered into this Agreement for the sole purpose of resolving the above admitted violation of providing gifts in excess of the allowable value to two employees of the General Assembly, for the payment in lieu of a late fee and fine, and for no other purpose.
